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## 2018 Gala Honoree TANI CANTIL-SAKAUYE

Chief Justice of California

The Honorable Tani Cantil-Sakauye is the 28th Chief Justice of California and the first Asian American and the second woman to serve as the chief justice of the nation's largest state judicial system. Cantil-Sakauye has served for more than 20 years on California appellate and trial courts. She has been appointed or elevated to higher office by three governors.

Cantil-Sakauye's background growing up in a poor farming family in Sacramento has informed her commitment to justice and to giving back to the community.

"Justice is supposed to be justice for all. Access for all. So that means all representative types. All of us bring a unique experience and our views and experience to the table."

Among her many accomplishments, Cantil-Sakauye created the first domestic violence court of its kind in 1998. As Chief Justice, she launched the Power of Democracy Civic Learning Initiative, which has a vision to help revitalize democracy and promote access to justice in California.

### 25th Anniversary Honorary Award EMERALD YEH

#### Journalist & Former KRON4 Anchor

Since the Asian Pacific Fund's founding in 1993, Emerald Yeh has been a strong leader with a vision for catalyzing the community's wealth to address its overlooked needs.

"With your help, we are shaping a dynamic Asian philanthropic presence in the Bay Area, ensuring that overlooked needs in the Asian community are addressed through millions of grant and scholarship dollars."

Yeh is a founding member of the Asian Pacific Fund who advocated for our formation as a board member of the United Way of the Bay Area. She has been on the board for 18 years, including five years as board chair leading the successful completion of the Fund's Endowment Campaign during the Fund's most formative years. Her leadership helped the Fund to secure \$12 million to invest in future grantmaking to the API community.

Yeh is a veteran journalist who anchored KRON4 News for nearly two decades. Her conscientious reporting has earned her nine Emmys and a United Press International Award.
