

2022 HIGHLIGHTS

As we move towards post-pandemic recovery, the Asian Pacific Fund stays committed as the only foundation dedicated to supporting the Bay Area's most vulnerable Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPIs).

In 2022, we mobilized \$1.9 million in funding to the AAPI community. The Fund continued to play the roles of resource mobilizer by connecting donors to nonprofits; direct funder by providing grants and scholarships; and convener by hosting a successful virtual API Summit and Gala. We also welcomed a new President & Executive Director and are excited to build on our success and take the Fund in new directions together.



Resiliency & Recovery Fund

The past two years have had lasting impact on the AAPI community. Recovering from the double pandemic of COVID-19 and anti-Asian hate will take time and resources. This year, we launched the Resiliency and Recovery Fund to support nonprofits on the ground who have tirelessly provided critical programs and services from the start. A total of \$750,000 in grants were awarded to 34 Bay Area organizations to strengthen and sustain this important safety net for our communities.

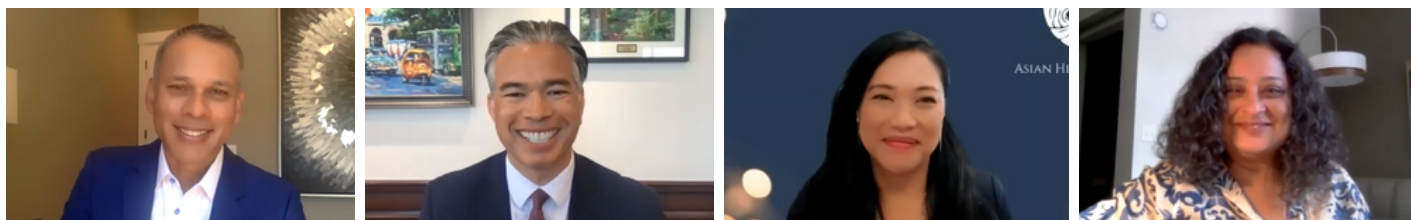
We had another phenomenal year for our third annual Give In May national campaign:
