
About the ACT for AANHPIs Fund

Learning from models like The Greenlight Fund and Latino Community Foundation's Nonprofit Accelerator, APF is launching a new program called Accelerating Capacity for Transformation for Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander Communities, or the ACT for AANHPIs Fund. This program centers AANHPI nonprofits by providing wrap-around, culturally relevant skill-building and mentorship that will enable selected nonprofits to scale their organizations and impact, while valuing and centering culture.

The ACT for AANHPIs Fund takes a multi-pronged approach that consists of the following components:

- Must be an APF affiliate network member or a fiscally sponsored project of an affiliate.
- Must have an operating budget between \$250,000 and \$3,000,000.

Selection Criteria

Proposals will be evaluated on:

- Vision for Scale- Proposal articulates a clear vision for how the organization can scale their impact over the next 3-5 years
- Market Need- Proposal clearly demonstrates the need for scale, e.g. a growing population and growing needs or opportunity.
- Political Will- Proposal reflects commitment of the organizational leadership and community to prioritize the investment in capacity and the desire to make organizational change happen as demonstrated by letters of support.
- Financial Health- Organization shows strong stewardship of resources as assessed through most recent 990.

 Readiness and Fit- Organization demonstrates a commitment to shared learning and has high potential to add diversity of experience and expertise to the overall cohort.

Priority will be given to organizations serving high-growth, high need AANHPI populations in areas with minimal AANHPI nonprofit infrastructure.

Grant Period: September 2024-October 2026

Amount: \$50,000 per year for 2 years (Total Award: \$100,000)

Expected Number of Organizations Selected: 4-5 grantees

Founded in 1993, the Asian Pacific Fund (APF) is the only community foundation dedicated to improving the lives of underserved and marginalized Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders (AANHPIs) in the Bay Area. We do this by:

- **Strengthening our Safety Net:** We fund and support an ecosystem of more than 90 Bay Area nonprofits serving AANHPI seniors, youth, and families; 40% of which have budgets of less than \$1 million.
- **Mobilizing Philanthropy:** We connect philanthropy to AANHPI-serving nonprofits, mobilizing funding, regionally and nationally, to increase our collective impact.
- Driving Change: We are informed by the voices in our community and lead by speaking out, convening thought leaders, and amplifying solutions that work.
- Our Affiliate Network: APF has deep roots in the AANHPI community through a vast
 network of affiliates that operate at multiple levels. From safety net service providers that
 keep our communities safe and healthy, to advocates who are driving systems and policy
 changes that improve well-being for all, this network is critical to promoting inclusion and
 belonging.
